The fiscal condition of the City is sound, and all obligations are being met on time.

Public Funds Investment Report. Above is the state of our portfolio as of o8-31-19 The Investment account underperformed again this period. The initial return offered by First United was 2.39% when the decision was made not to move the funds from our local bank, but in June the fund return fell to 1.9%. This was because the account pays at the Treasury Bill Rate which fell to 1.9% in June. In July the Fed voted to lower the rate again, this time, to 1.64%. The Fed stated that this move was to encourage inflation and to sustain economic growth, which had slowed this quarter. Although U.S. economic expansion continues, the actual rate of growth is declining. The general consensus is that interest rates will remain low for the foreseeable future. Meanwhile, TexPool's daily rate also fell from 2.395% to 2.19% as of o8-31-19 The difference in yield is, in dollars paid to the city, FUB paid \$1,241.77 for the month of July. Had our investment been with TexPool it would have yielded \$1,649.41. This is a difference of \$407.64. If the trend stabilizes, as is the common consensus, the city will forgo \$4,891.68 in revenue this coming year. I inform you of this fact because I am seriously considering the benefit to revenues for the city

The Budget. The final budget is included in the session package. The Tax Rate can be adopted no sooner than 3 days after the second hearing or, no sooner than September 13th. I will be attending a training at TML for Employment Law for Public Sector Workers to get updates to Texas Employment Law following the Legislative Session and will not be able to attend a meeting to adopt the rate until Monday, September 16th. On that date both the budget and tax rate can be adopted. I will post the agenda for that meeting before I leave town and will have it published in the news paper as well.

Resolutions to be adopted this session. Two resolutions will be presented this evening. 19-09-09-a is a resolution to reject a rate increase by Xcel energy on advice from the attorneys at the West Texas Council of Governments. 19-09-09-b is a resolution to accept the settlement offer for a rate increase from Atmos Energy. Copies of the resolutions are included in the packet along with background materials in each resolution. Bothe resolutions must be passed before October 1st.

Variance for setting a mobile home in a commercial zone. I understand that this is not a zoning variance but a "Special Use Permit" I will have the address in question and the name of the individual

seeking the permit at the meeting. After the Mayor introduces the agenda item, someone can make a motion to grant the Special Use Permit at (address and name) for placing a mobile home on the site with the understanding that the permit shall remain in force only so long as the mobile home is used as a residence by (name or other name) and when these parties move out the lot will revert to commercial use only. This will be entered in the minutes and should be all that is required.
