# CITY SECRETARY'S REPORT TO THE COUNCIL

The fiscal condition of the City is sound, and all obligations are being met on time.

**Public Funds Investment Report.** Above is the state of our portfolio as of 07-31-2020. The fiscal condition of the city remains solid.

#### Issues that will require action:

A resolution to establish a dedicated fund in the administrative budget for adoption related expenses incurred by Reed's Ranch and Rescue. This is necessary in order to explain/justify our breach of (Tex. Const. Art. III, Sec. 52 and Art. XI, Sec. 3.) This action is on advice of counsel (see Spay & Neuter memo: Monte Akers 07-08-2020).

Texas Water Development Board had been assigned to administer a grant fund from the Environmental Protection Agency in the amount of \$3,346,000. Because we had begun an application for funding with TWDB earlier this year, we have been selected as a likely candidate to receive this funding based on our need and overall financial condition. The grant will be awarded in conjunction with a low interest loan from TWDB for water improvements that will address arsenic (the basis for the grant) The combined project will be \$6,084,000. At 55% grant and 45% loan. The project will be to replace the water tower and all surface storage tanks along with infrastructure improvements in the water supply system. I have secured the services of a Bond Council and Financial Advisor and have prepared a Resolution to apply for funding for action tonight. Should the city be awarded this grant, it will save the taxpayers nearly 4 million dollars for the improvements that will have to be done regardless of funding source. The application will have to be submitted by the end of August at the latest. I will be able to meet this deadline but, first I will need the Application Filing and Authorized Representative Resolution enacted.

An action by the council acting to order the demolition of a dangerous building. (see FILBERTO HERNANDEZ 611 Ave. I and Pages from Ordinance 20-13-01 sec. 20)

Nomination of Zoning Board Members drawn from the respective districts of the council.

Discussion Changes to budget and tax as a result of SB-2 (see Budget-Tax requirements and deadlines) the department requested budgets have been submitted and the council should be able to begin the budget workshops. The "No New Revenue" tax rate has not yet been sent to me from GCAD but I know that it is being worked on and should be available soon. In the meantime, I am reasonably sure the calculation I have made is close to the figure we will see from the official worksheet. (SEE Budget-no new revenue)
